Findings of the Committee:

Allegation 1:

On or around 29 August 2008, at Argos, Blackpool Retail Park, Cork, Dr Gbadebo

(Alabi) induced a representative of Argos, Blackpool Retail Park to repay €599.99 upon the return of a computer which was not the computer which had been purchased.

Having regard to the evidence adduced, the Committee found that :

Allegation 1 was proven as to fact.

Reason:

This was admitted by Dr Gbadebo (Alabi)

Allegation 1 did amount to professional misconduct.

Reason:

The Committee was satisfied beyond a reasonable doubt that Dr Gbadebo's (Alabi's) conduct was conduct which doctors of experience, competence and good repute consider disgraceful or dishonourable.

Allegation 2:

That Dr Gbadebo (Alabi) made a sworn declaration for the benefit of the Health Service Executive ("the HSE") in or around August 2010 which he knew or ought to have known was a false declaration, taking into account in particular paragraphs 2, 3, 5 and 6 in circumstances where he was the subject of a Garda investigation and/or pending prosecution arising from the matter referred to at Allegation 1 above.

Allegation 2 was proven as to fact.

Reason:

The Committee was satisfied beyond a reasonable doubt that Dr Gbadebo (Alabi) completed and signed the statutory declaration and that he ought to have known that paragraph 3 in particular was a false declaration in circumstances where he was the subject of a Garda investigation and where there was a pending prosecution at the time of making the declaration.

Allegation 2 did amount to professional misconduct.

Reason:

The Committee was satisfied beyond a reasonable doubt that Dr Gbadebo's (Alabi's) conduct was conduct which doctors of experience, competence and good repute consider disgraceful or dishonourable.

Allegation 3:

That Dr. Gbadebo (Alabi) failed to notify the HSE, without delay or at all, that he had been convicted of an offence pursuant to Section 6 of the Criminal Justice (Theft and Fraud Offences) Act, 2001.

Allegation 3 was proven as to fact.

Reason:

This was admitted by Dr Gbadebo (Alabi).

Allegation 3 did amount to professional misconduct.

Reason:

The Committee was satisfied beyond a reasonable doubt that Dr Gbadebo's (Alabi's) conduct was conduct which doctors of experience, competence and good repute consider disgraceful or dishonourable.
